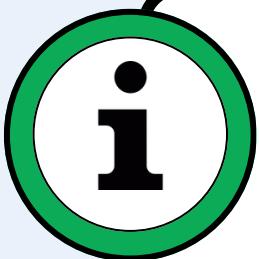


SPRINT REVIEW

EVENT INFORMATION

- The Sprint Review is the second to last event of the Sprint Working Session
- Timeboxed to a maximum of **four** hours for a one-month Sprint.
- Attends Scrum Team (ST) and Stakeholders (SH)
- Inputs : Increment, Sprint Goal, Product Backlog (PB), Market or Business conditions
- Outcome: Feedback on increment, updated PB, Next Step, Validation of Product Direction, Alignment ST and SH



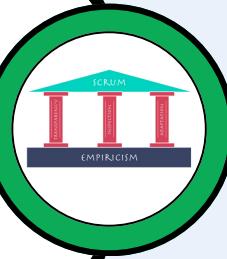
BENEFITS

- Share the increments and the work
- Ask for stakeholder feedback
- Update the product backlog
- Identify next steps
- Facilitate collaboration between Scrum Team and Stakeholders



FORMAT

- Working Session
- Scrum Team and Stakeholders here active participants
- Make things Transparent to the Stakeholders
- Keep it engaging and interactive
- Think in outcomes and not outputs
- Avoid irrelevant details and stick to timebox



EMPIRICAL PILLARS OF SCRUM

Transparency

- transparency on the value your product is providing

Inspection

- Inspection of the sprint outcomes and questions about the outcomes
- Inspection of how the outcomes contribute to the product goal
- Inspection of external conditions, such as market conditions
- Inspection of internal constraints, such as milestones, budgets, and timelines

Adaption

- If needed update the product backlog - Refining the product
- What do next if needed change plan - Reorder the Product Backlog



SPRINT REVIEW IS NOT

- Presentation or demo but more than that
- One way talk without stakeholder feedback
- Presenting Product backlog items that don't met DoD
- Blaming and shaming session



NEGLECTING SPRINT REVIEW

- Missed opportunities for feedback
- Lack of stakeholder engagement
- No adaptation of the product backlog
- Missed Opportunity for Adaptation
- Lack of current state of product and risk of surprise
- Undermines Scrum's emphasis on Transparency, Inspection and adaptation
- Here the Scrum Team do the right things?



KEY STEPS OF A SPRINT RETROSPECTIVE

1. **Start with the purpose**
 - Show the product Goal and Sprint Goal
 - What the team trying to achieve
2. **Showcase the increment**
 - Show working increments that met the DoD
 - Ask stakeholders if the increment meets their expectations and if it aligns with the product vision
3. **Invite stakeholder feedback**
 - What do they like? What concerns do they have? Do they see any risks or opportunities?
4. **Discuss what's next**
 - Use the sprint review to align everyone on the next phase of work.
5. **Adapt the product backlog**
 - Based on the discussions, the product owner should make necessary adjustments.
6. **Close with alignment**
